

What is your current profession/role?

My current role with UCSD is as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker with both outpatient Palliative Care and Geriatric Medicine. In the coming months I will also be supporting our inpatient Palliative Team.

What initially inspired and motivated you to pursue a career in Social Work?

Growing up in San Diego undocumented, I grew up dreaming of one day being able to attend a university. I've always wanted to be in a helping profession. Initially I wanted to be an elementary school teacher; however, quickly learned while working at an after-school program that it was not for me. I then decided to pursue a degree that would allow me to still work in a school as a school counselor instead. Along the way I discovered social work and the many shapes and forms the field has.

What parts of your work have been particularly inspiring or rewarding for you?

Seeing the difference I make in people's lives is the most rewarding. When they feel heard, respected, and validated, that's when I feel I am making a difference. I may not be able to change the situation for that person, but I can walk along with them. While gaining my clinical hours to become licensed, I had different types of supervisors that inspired me and others who fell short. This experience brought me to taking on the position of Clinical Supervisor in order to be the positive mentorship to someone else. My experience helped me see the value of having a good leader and the difference it can make in the shaping of our future therapists. Being in a leadership position was fulfilling; however, I longed for being back to face-to-face interactions with patients. I am thankful for UCSD for giving me the opportunity to learn more about medical social work through Palliative and Geriatric Medicine.

What is your go-to stress relief activity during a busy workweek?

My favorite would be to find ways to laugh, with family and friends. I also enjoy doing my own nails, painting, and binge-watching favorite shows.

If you had to choose a different profession, what would it be?

My first reaction is to say I would choose Social Work again because I feel it's a great fit for my personal values. If I had to choose a different profession, I would choose to be a college professor. It can still happen!


Congratulations to Dr. Toluwalasé A. Ajayi!
