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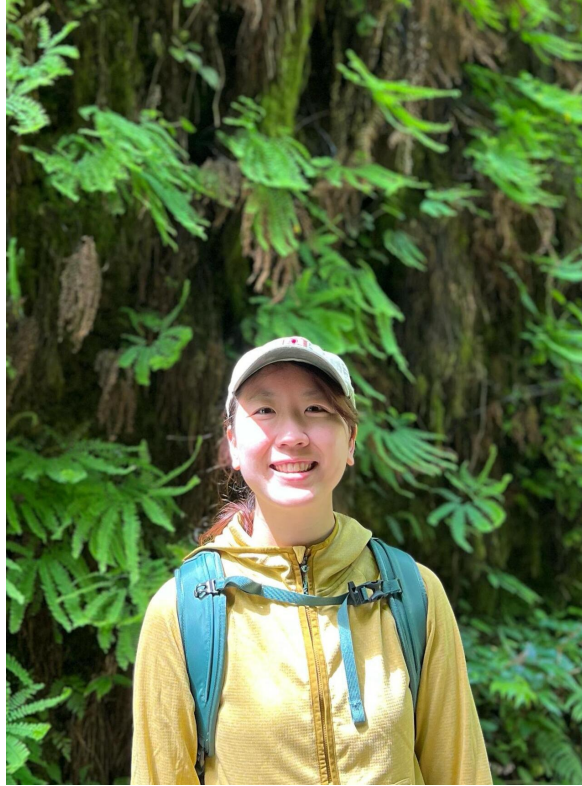

Spotlight: Belicia Ding, MD



What is your current profession/role?

I am a geriatrician for the UCSD at Home program, conducting clinical visits at patients' homes.

What initially inspired and motivated you to pursue a career in your field?

Throughout my medical training, I was inspired by fantastic mentors in the field of Geriatrics. I was initially inspired by my mentor in medical school, Dr. Anita Major, who provided home-based primary care. I was deeply impressed by the relationship and trust that she and her interdisciplinary team built with their patients. The experience of working with the team sparked my journey into Geriatrics and especially home-based care.

What parts of your work have been particularly inspiring or rewarding for you?

What I love most about my work is that I'm able to visit my patients in the comforts of their own homes! I get a chance to know my patients on a more personal level, and being in their home environments, I'm able to readily identify care barriers that I may never learn from typical clinic visits.

What is your go-to stress relief activity during a busy workweek?

I'm a big reader, whether in paper form or as audiobooks during my drive to and from patients' homes. I especially love memoirs and fictions on immigrant stories, though recently I've been on a fantasy binge, so let me know if you need any book recommendations!

Caregiving in the US 2025: A National Portrait of Family Caregivers

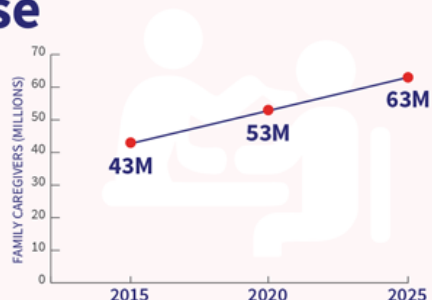
A Dramatic Increase

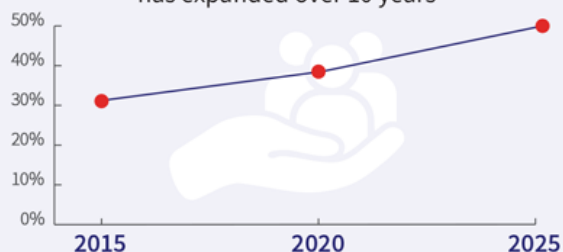
23% find it **difficult** to take care of their **own health**

Congrats to Dr. Lindsey Yourman!

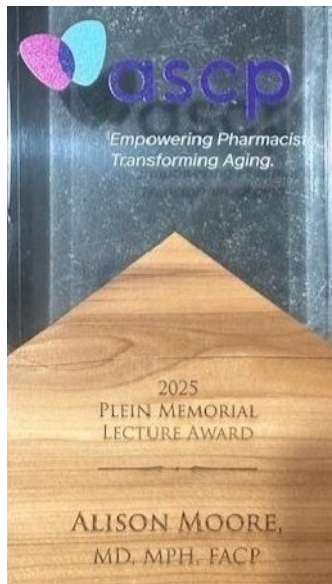
